#### 2.2. SME relevance

TC53/WG16 It will take a few years to complete but will cover a broad aspect of scaffolding some SME's will have to learn. There will be many changes to existing norms. It may not be complex but should be the new bible for Scaffolding.

The relevance is the same as already stated in the last years:

The individual character of scaffolding as a craft is depending on special products. The obligation to stick to regulations as technical standards forces the contractors to use exclusively products that fulfil the performance requirements given in these standards. Any significant change in these standards might affect the market in a way, that large investments in new products become necessary.

All standards in the scope of TC 53 are affecting huge amounts of equipment of our member enterprises. There is no difference, which product is taken into consideration: scaffolds, protection fans, encapsulation systems or even mobile access towers. Each modification in a standard changes the conditions for SMEs and might cause serious additional costs for SMEs.

It is generally known that the products scaffolders use have a long durability. If they are treated with care and not misused they can be used without any problem for a long span of time, in most cases for decades. The intended modifications of standards are often unjustified and counter-productive, as they do not reflect the needs of the SMEs. Allowing standards to be developed without regarding the practical needs of SMEs should be avoided.

The newly founded WG 16 met for the first time on 23 February 2021 under the chairmanship of Dr Christian Fröhlich. The new WG has set itself the goal of summarising fundamental, overarching specifications and rules that apply to all individual standards in a uniform manner in a standard, referred to below as a "core standard". This core standard is to take precedence over all other technical standards; all technical standards are to refer to the "core standard" in the future. The specifications made in the "core standard" only have to be mentioned in the individual technical standards if they need to be deviated from.

Apart from the clear delimitation of the areas of application, the adaptation to the regulations of the Eurocodes will probably also be the content of the "core standard", as various regulations of the standards of TC 53 still originate from the 1990s. In particular, it must be taken into account that due to special features in the design, manufacture and application of temporary building aids, deviating regulations to the Eurocodes may be necessary. With the concept of the "core standard", an adaptation to future amendments of the Eurocodes is possible across the board and generally valid for all standards of CEN/TC 53.

The first step was to define the work assignment and the scope of application. Subgroups were formed for the further processing steps. I am together with Ken Johnson in the material subgroup.



#### **Annex A: SBS Mirror Committee**

SBS has established a series of Working Groups for several sectors: Construction, Personal protective equipment (PPE) & Textile Care, Lifts, ICT, Sustainability. If your activities are part of these sectors, we expect you to participate in the relevant SBS Committee and therefore you are not requested to establish a Mirror Committee. If none of these groups cover the sector/topics of your TC or you are not part of these sectors, you are required to establish and maintain an SBS Mirror Committee, which is kept informed about the different developments in the TC/SC/WG and provides advice/input to the expert's work. The minimum requirement is for the expert to set up a Mirror Committee composed of at least three people, each of them coming from a different country.

The SBS mirror committee is the network that the expert uses to ensure a European position in standardisation matters. It can be the technical committee(s) of the European organisation supporting the expert or a personal network promoting the SME issues in standardisation or contacts of an SBS sector network. 
